Gracious and loving God, who stands with us in moments of disaster and loss, continue to uphold and support your people remembering this day and the deep loss and grief that come unbidden. Enfold us by your grace in this moment that we may know the healing power of your love; through Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. **Amen.**
