TODAY we gather to witness and join in ancient rites of the Church which affirm the centrality of the Sacrament of Holy Baptism which is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body, the Church.

IN CONFIRMATION, those baptized at an early age make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism, receiving the laying on of hands by the Bishop. In this Sacramental Rite, the Holy Spirit is invoked upon those making their profession before the Bishop, who represents the whole Church.

RECEPTION is a rite for those who *have been confirmed* in other branches of the church catholic and now desire to be received by the Bishop into the Episcopal Church. As part of Christ's one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, the Episcopal Church honors the confirmation of churches such as the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox.

THOSE PERSONS WHO DESIRE TO REAFFIRM their baptismal vows in the presence of the Bishop, have been previously baptized and confirmed. They now desire for their own spiritual renewal to rededicate themselves to Christ and actively participate in the full fellowship of Christ's Church.

WELCOME to the Rite of Confirmation, Reception, and the Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows. Our Diocese of Newark celebrates most of these liturgies within the fifty days of Easter, with a few taking place shortly after those fifty days. We seek to carry out a long and historic tradition of the church, and in these diocesan settings speak clearly to our call to actively participate in the larger Anglican Communion of which the Episcopal Church and our local congregations play important parts.

Confirmaciones Diócesis de Newark

HOY estamos congregados para dar testimonio y unirnos a los ritos ancestrales de la Iglesia que afirman la centralidad del Sacramento del Santo Bautismo, el cual es iniciación completa en el Cuerpo de Cristo, la Iglesia, por medio del agua y del Espíritu Santo.

EN LA CONFIRMACIÓN, quienes fueron bautizados en una edad temprana, hacen una afirmación madura pública y consciente de fe y entrega a las responsabilidades del Bautismo, y reciben por parte de la Obispa la imposición de las manos. En este Rito Sacramental, el Espíritu Santo se invoca sobre quienes hacen su profesión de fe y entrega ante el Obispa, quien representa a toda la Iglesia.

LA RECEPCIÓN es un rito para quienes han sido confirmados en otras ramas de la iglesia católica y ahora desean ser recibidos por la Obispa en la Iglesia Episcopal. Como parte de la Iglesia de Cristo, que es una, santa, católica y apostólica, la Iglesia Episcopal honra la confirmación de Iglesias como la Católica Romana y la Ortodoxa Oriental.

LAS PERSONAS QUE DESEAN REAFFIRMAR sus votos bautismales en la presencia de la Obispa han sido bautizadas y confirmadas previamente. Ahora desean dedicarse nuevamente a Cristo y participar activamente en la hermandad total de la Iglesia de Cristo por su propia renovación espiritual.

BIENVENIDOS al Rito de Confirmación, Recepción y Reafirmación de Votos Bautismales. Nuestra Diócesis de Newark celebra la mayoría de estos ritos durante los cincuenta días de Pascua, con algunas llevándose a cabo poco tiempo después. Tenemos el propósito de continuar una tradición larga e histórica de la Iglesia, y en estas celebraciones de la diócesis expresar claramente nuestro llamado a participar activamente en la Comunión Anglicana, en la cual la Iglesia Episcopal y nuestras congregaciones locales, desempeñan papeles fundamentales.

FIRST READING

1 Samuel 3:1-10

Lector A reading from the First Book of Samuel.

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down, and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place. 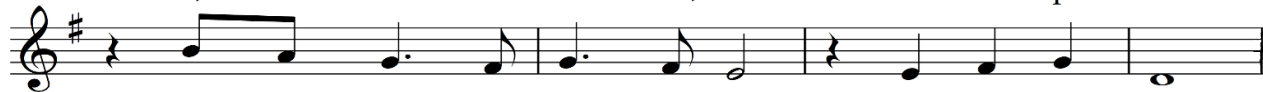

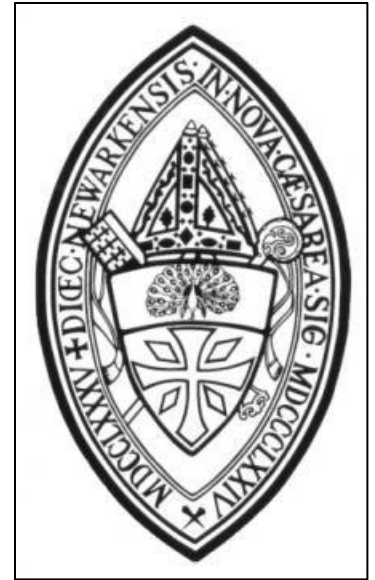

About the Diocese of Newark

The Diocese of Newark is part of the worldwide Anglican Communion represented in the United States (as well as some other parts of the world) by The Episcopal Church. It was established in 1874 as the Diocese of Northern New Jersey by the third Bishop of New Jersey, William Henry Odenheimer, who then became its first Bishop. In 1886 the diocese changed its name to the Diocese of Newark.

The diocese comprises the northern third of New Jersey, with congregations in Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Morris, Passaic, Sussex, Warren, and Union counties. More than 3.5 million people live within its bounds. It is a largely urban diocese, and includes the two largest cities in the state, Newark and Jersey City. The western and northern portions of the diocese are far less densely populated, some areas being rural in character, wooded and mountainous. Of New Jersey's 566 municipalities, 206 are located in the diocese.



There are 93 active congregations and four affiliated worshipping communities located in the Diocese of Newark. There are approximately 19,000 worshipping Episcopalians and we have around 110 active ordained clergy, both men and women. Our worship is vibrant and varied, with liturgical expression ranging from Anglo-Catholic to liberation to conservative to liberal Protestant to Evangelical.

At the heart of Episcopal worship is the Book of Common Prayer (the BCP), and within it, the principal weekly worship service is the Holy Eucharist—also known as Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper, or Mass. It is called “common prayer” because Anglicans pray it together, around the world. Since its introduction in the 16th century, the purpose of the BCP has been to provide in one place a core of instructions and rites for Anglican Christians to worship together. Within its pages you will find the main beliefs of our church as well as the order of service for various forms of sacramental worship, such as Holy Communion, Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage, Burial, and Confession/Reconciliation.

We believe that we are called by Jesus Christ, whose power transforms us into a new community. Together, we strive to express that transformation in the world around us. The Diocese of Newark collaborates with God in the mission of Jesus in the 21st century, providing opportunities to grow spiritually, to serve and advocate for those who are marginalized, and to receive expressions of healing and care.

Our passion for diversity and inclusion has called us to be among the leading advocates for equality and justice for people of all races, cultures, religions, and socio-economic backgrounds. We are proud to have been among the first dioceses to ordain women to the priesthood and to ordain openly gay clergy. In 2018 we celebrated the historic election and consecration of Newark's first African-American and first female bishop, the Rt. Rev. Carlye J. Hughes.

About The Episcopal Church

As Episcopalians, we believe in and follow the teachings of Jesus Christ, whose life, death, and resurrection saved the world.

We believe that God loves you – no exceptions.

The Episcopal Church embraces a legacy of inclusion, aspiring to tell and exemplify God’s love for every human being; people of all genders and sexual orientations serve as bishops, priests, and deacons in our church. Laypeople and clergy work together in leadership and governance.

The Episcopal Church welcomes all who worship Jesus Christ and comprises 108 dioceses and three mission areas in 22 countries or territories.

While The Episcopal Church is headquartered in New York City, we are not a national church—we are a multinational denomination.

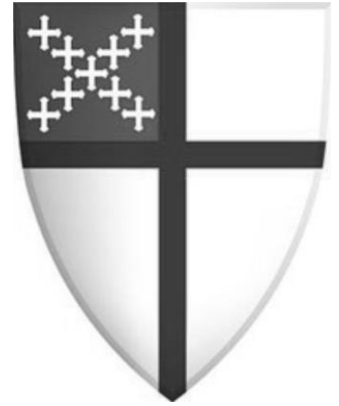

The mission of the church, as stated in the Book of Common Prayer’s catechism, is “to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.”

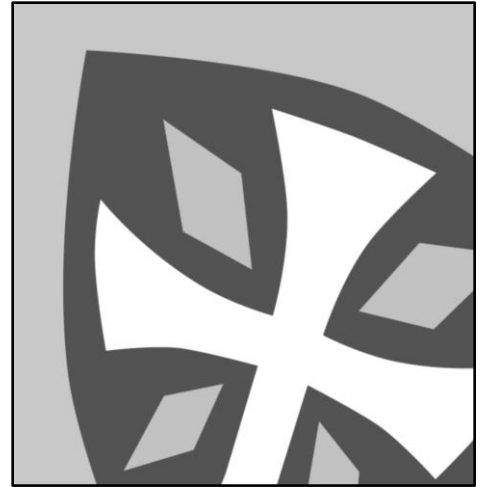
In step with that mission, The Episcopal Church follows Jesus into loving, liberating, and life-giving relationships with God, with each other, and with the earth.

About Diocesan Outreach, Congregational Support, and Scholarships



Every year, the Episcopal Diocese of Newark provides much-needed outreach, congregational support and scholarship funds. Last year, the diocese provided more than \$1.5 million in outreach, congregational support and scholarships.

Where were these funds used?

Here are just a few examples:

- Volunteers in congregational food pantries and shelters received assistance.
- Congregational leaders were able to focus on ministry after receiving funds to address unforeseen building issues.
- Funding extends internationally as well, with support to the Episcopal Church worldwide, as well as other strategic international funding opportunities.



DIOCESE OF JERUSALEM

The Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East

The Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem is home to about 7000 Anglicans worshipping within twenty-eight different congregations. It is also responsible for more than thirty institutions, including hospitals, schools, clinics, rehabilitation centers, guesthouses, and

retirement homes. Archbishop Hosam oversees all of these parishes and institutions, which are scattered across five separate countries or territories: Jordan, Palestine, Lebanon, Syria, and Israel. This geographic spread adds innumerable complications to the work of the Diocese due to the many borders, checkpoints, and national governments involved. In particular, the divergent laws and politics of each region make the administration of these ministries exceedingly challenging.

Despite these difficulties, the Diocese responds actively to the need for healthcare and education in areas where many cannot afford it, making no distinction between religion, ethnicity, or gender. The Diocese especially considers education for the next generation of leaders to be a vital bridge-building contribution that helps bring stability to an otherwise troubled region. Thus, our diocesan schools not only teach students academic and vocational skills, but also seek to engender within them a spirit of peace, respect, and cooperation—all based upon Christian values. In so doing, the Diocese offers a voice of moderation and reconciliation to our interfaith neighbors.

Beyond our parish and institutional work, the Diocese of Jerusalem also sponsors a number of other ministries. The Diocesan Department for Peace, Reconciliation, and Interfaith Dialogue, for instance, was established in 2007. It encourages participation in the Jerusalem Peacebuilders program and supports other interfaith peace-building efforts.

In another field, our Women's Ministry brings diocesan women together in a regular series of meetings and biannual conferences with the aim of strengthening relationships, increasing skills, and building community. In yet another area, our Diocesan guesthouses extend our ministry of hospitality to pilgrims and other visitors.

Because of political strife and lack of economic opportunity, the Christian population west of the Jordan river has dwindled from more than 25% a century ago to less than 2% today. In the face of this diminishing Christian presence, our diocesan ministries sustain and strengthen our witness, shining the light of Christ into areas of darkness, and offering hope to those otherwise living in despair.
