CONSTITUTION

Article 2.

There shall be a Convention of the Church in this Diocese, on the second Saturday in May in each year, or on such other day as may be specially appointed by the Ecclesiastical Authority. The Convention shall be held at the Cathedral unless the Ecclesiastical Authority appoints otherwise.

THE ISSUE IS UNITY

THE BISHOP'S THIRD ANNUAL ADDRESS TO CONVENTION

This will be my third address to the Convention of the Diocese of Newark as its Bishop, but it will be my thirteenth address to the Convention as a Bishop. A month from today, I shall begin my thirteenth year as a bishop. I have not heretofore thought of myself as a victim of treiskaidekaphobia, but as I survey the issues the Church faces in this thirteenth year of my episcopate, I am not sure that I regard thirteen as a particularly lucky number.

Before proceeding further, I should like to pause and reflect with you upon a few lines of scripture found in the fourth chapter of the Epistle to the Ephesians. St. Paul, or someone who thought and wrote remarkably like him, has been reminding his readers of the great love of God, who in Christ Jesus has reached out to all people and broken down the walls that alienated them from himself and from one another. God, he wrote, has called both Jew and Gentile to become part of his household, part of a building that has the apostles and prophets for its foundations, and Christ Jesus for its main cornerstone. Now he entreats his readers:

"I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you therefore to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is Father of all, over all, through all, and within all. Each one of us, however, has been given his own share of grace, given as Christ allotted it ... And to some his gift was that they should become apostles; to some prophets; to some evangelists; to some pastors and teachers; so that the saints together make a unity in the work of service, building up the body of Christ. In this way we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself." (Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-13 Jerusalem Bible)

I have directed our attention to this particular passage, although I might have chosen others in the Epistles to the Romans and the Corinthians in which the Apostle reminds us of our oneness and interdependence in the body of Christ, because as I look ahead to the decisions which we must make in this Convention, and in the Special Convention in March, and to the decisions which the Episcopal Church must make at its General Convention in September, the issue which overshadows all others is our unity in Christ and the unity of His Church.

Let me mention only four of those decisions: Two which seem to be the particular responsibility of our own Conventions, and two which, almost without, question, will be the principal concerns of the General Convention. The two before our own Conventions are decisions regarding the budget for the program of the diocese in 1976 and the election of a Bishop Coadjutor. The two before the General Convention relate to the Proposed Draft of the Book of Common Prayer and to the admission of women to the ordained ministry of the Church as priests and as bishops.

It may appear that the decisions relating to our Program Budget for 1976 are purely monetary affairs. How shall we adapt the proposed budget to accomodate to an anticipated income which will be approximately \$138,000. less than the budget projected? If we live up to the mandate of last year's Convention and make the asking of the national Church a first priority, what projects in our own program must be cut back or eliminated altogether? If we begin by asking what is the least amount of money required to carry out those diocesan programs which seem absolutely essential, what needs in the Church's mission to the peoples of our own land and those in other lands must go unfulfilled?

The issue is not monetary. The issue is unity. The issue is our own congregations' sense of involvement in the mission of the whole Church, their sense of relationship and commitment to the diocese's work in the cities and the countryside, its mission to families who cannot now and may never be able to support a parish church in which the sacraments may be ministered and through which the love of God may be communicated to the surrounding neighborhood. The issue is this diocese's sense of being involved in and committed to the divine imperative of our Lord that His Church shall proclaim the gospel to all the world. Are we one family in the diocese? Are we part of a world-wide Church?

It has been both my joy and my sorrow through these thirteen years to observe that a congregation's participation in the life and program of the Church beyond its parochial borders bears only a casual relationship to its ability to contribute to that life and support that program. Year after year, some congregations respond generously and even sacrificially to the challenge of Christ's mission, while others, comparatively as well off or even more able, make token contributions, and those grudgingly. I have been a parish priest and the rector of a parish. I know that money given to support the mission of the Church in the diocese, the nation, and the world could be put to good use within the parish. I know that every gift implies sacrifice: And I know that every gift is an acknowledgment of our membership in a wider community. That goes for the individual's or the family's gift to the parish church, for the parish church's gift beyond itself, and for the diocese's acceptance of the share assigned it in the broader work of the Church. The issue is not money; it is unity, our oneness in the body of Christ.

In another month, we shall be meeting to elect a Bishop Coadjutor. A committee of fifteen has devoted untold hours and care to the preparation of the diocese for this decision, to receiving nominations, consulting references, and interviewing nominees. The committee has announced its intention to put five names in nomination for the office. On the day of the Convention, in all likelihood, others will be nominated from the floor. From what I have heard or know of the nominees proposed or likely to be proposed, the Diocese may count itself fortunate to be able to choose from among so many qualified men. We believe and pray that God's Holy Spirit will inform and guide the Deputies at the Special Convention in their election of the Bishop Coadjutor. We also know that often God chooses to work through human agents. It will not, therefore, surprise us to discover that the Holy Spirit has many volunteers ready and willing to help inform the Convention in its choice of this or that particular nominee. This is a natural state of affairs. Again, I would say the real issue is not the election of a particular nominee but the unity of the diocese in supporting its new Bishop by its prayers and in his work. God will give us as good a man as we deserve, and he will be as good a bishop as we, with God's help, let him become.

This seems an apt moment to digress from the issues before the Church and pay my own debt of gratitude to all those priests and layfolk, men and women, upon whose prayers, presence, and support I have depended through these thirteen years and, more particularly, through these last two. That I have not done a better job is not your responsibility, but that I have not done a far worse job is to your credit. I cannot begin to name you individually and hope to conclude this address tonight. But if I could, I should want to acknowledge a debt I can never repay to Kenneth Anand, to me far more than an Assistant Bishop, a friend, spiritual adviser, and example of Christian humility and dedication. I should want to thank Bishop Stark, whose continuing support is invaluable, the staff at Cathedral House, the members of the Standing Committee, the Diocesan Council, and all the other Committees, Commissions, and Departments of the Diocese. And then I should have to go on to hundreds and thousands of men and women in the congregations of the Diocese who have helped both by their support and by their constructive criticism. As St. Paul wrote to the Church at Philippi, "I thank my God whenever I think of you; and every time I pray for you all, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News." (I:3-4 Jerusalem.)

In Minnesota next September, the Episcopal Church will be facing decisions even more crucial than it faced at South Bend in 1969, perhaps as crucial as those it faced at the time of the Civil War. This Church could divide, or suffer the loss of a significant number of its members, as a result of decisions relating to the adoption of a New Prayer Book or to the admission of women to the orders of priests and bishops in our Church. The first concern, at least, appears to be somewhat less divisive than it seemed a few years ago, but the division over the second has escalated almost to a point at which reconciliation between the opposing views seems unattainable.

I could, of course, be completely mistaken about how divisive the decision relating to The Draft Proposed Book of Common Prayer may become. Until the Book itself has come into general circulation and been the subject of some study, it is quite impossible to know how far The Standing Liturgical Commission has gone in response to those who want to retain as much as possible of the 1928 Book of Common Prayer. If the Proposed Book, as rumored, should offer as the "First Service" a Eucharist and Orders of Morning and Evening Prayer which are fundamentally in the language of the 1928 Book but have rubrics which legitimate an order of service heretofore found only in unauthorized Missals, and if, in addition, as the Presiding Bishop himself seems to favor, the continued use of the 1928 Book under the license of the diocesan bishop is permitted, -- a couple of big "ifs" -- then, perhaps, the major opposition to the Proposed Book would center upon its bulk.

I, for one, would be glad if the Convention were to decide to give the people of the Church the option of worshipping almighty God in the majestic and solemn language we have used since Cranmer's time or in the more modern idiom of today's speech. I can find fault with either, and yet there are times when I need to be able to address my needs, my hopes, my aspirations to God in traditional forms, and times when I need a freer, more contemporary expression. Nor is it a matter of language alone. There are times when the more penitential approach of the traditional form expresses my own mood and need, and times when the glad expression of thanksgiving found in the "Second Order" or even "The Third Order" liberates my spirit for communion with God and with my fellow Christians. I hope that I am correct in believing that the unity of our Church is not in jeopardy over this matter.

But I know that it is in jeopardy over the question of the ordination of women as priests and bishops in our Chruch. I think you all know on which side my own sympathies and convictions lie. I hope that you believe that, despite these sympathies and convictions, I respect persons whose opinions differ radically from my own. God knows, I have them both to the right and to the left of me. And that is where the issue lies with me.

The General Convention cannot evade the question, and it will be given no opportunity to do so. For the responsibility for decisions rests with the Convention, not with individual dioceses, bishops, priests, deacons, or layfolk. And, under our polity, what the Convention decides is, for the time being, the decision of the Church.

It is my own conviction that God is leading His Church to the acceptance of the full ministry of women within it, not as their right, but by His call. If the ministry of Christ was, as we believe, the perfect ministry of humankind, that ministry must include the feminine as well as the masculine attributes of humanity. "Male and female created He them." It is my prayer that this Church, the Episcopal Church, will recognize the Holy Spirit's guiding influence, "leading

us into all truth," in the growing insistence upon the recognition of the ministry of women in the Church. Two Provinces of the Anglican Communion have declared themselves ready, under certain conditions, to ordain women to the priesthood. The Church of England declares itself in sympathy with the principle, but exercises characteristic British reserve in the application of the principle. I see no reason why the Epsicopal Church should hold back and wait -- how long? -- for the Roman Catholic and the Orthodox Chruches to respond to the Spirit that is moving within our branch of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Chruch. It was said at Lambeth in 1968, "The New Testment does not encourage us to believe that nothing must ever be done for the first time."

I am under no delusion that the Diocese of Newark is of one mind in this matter. I have been under a compulsion to speak my mind. The pages of THE NEWARK CHURCHMAN, in which, I assume, this address will be published, will be open for the response of those who have another mind.

Having, then, told you where I stand, let me reiterate my conviction that the real issue is unity. The General Convention, and only the General Convention, speaks and acts for the Church. It adopts, amends, and interprets the Constitution and Canons of the Church. Much as I desire that it will amend or interpret the present Constitution and Canons of the Church so as to recognize the eligibility of women for ordination to the priesthood and episcopate, if it does not, it is not my present intention either to bolt the Church or to act in defiance of General Convention's action. Three times in the course of my ministry, I have solemnly engaged to conform to the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of the Protestant Episcopal Chruch. Conformity is neither easy nor exciting, but it is a way of maintaining the essential unity of the body. It is my earnest prayer that by remaining within the body, I may in some way minister to those who are hurt, (and many will be hurt, no matter how the decision goes,) and help them, also, to remain in the body.

Let me close on a note of hope. If there is one experience that stands out in my memories of the past year, it is the experience of a growing and developing fellowship between the clergy of the Diocese and those of the Roman Catholic Chruch in the Archdiocese of Newark and the Diocese of Paterson. For some eight years there has been a rather high degree of fellowship among the heads of the religious judicatories in the State of New Jersey. This has included the Bishops of the Roman. Catholic Dioceses, the Bishops of the Episcopal Dioceses, the Bishop of the Methodist Church, the heads of major Protestant denominations in New Jersey, and more recently, the representative of the New Jersey Council of Rabbis. Nothing in this experience, however, prepared me for the depth and intensity of the fellowship that developed during the three meetings of Roman and Episcopal priests and bishops held at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, Darlington; Christ Church, Ridgewood; and Cathedral House. I have never before felt the real anguish of our seperation from our Roman brothers and sisters until

our second meeting when we shared our common understanding of the Eucharist but realized that we could not yet partake of that Eucharist together. To have such an experience of fellowship and to be unable to express it in that act of worship through which all Christians are bound together in their Lord was in itself a revelation and conviction of "the serious dangers we are in by our unhappy divisions."

Out of that experience, multiplied in hundreds and thousands of other individuals and places, will come, I am convinced, a renewed determination to bind again the wounds in the Body of Christ and to accomplish that oneness and harmony for which our Master prayed.

For "we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself."

RULES OF ORDER

102ND ANNUAL CONVENTION FEBRUARY 6TH & 7TH

CONVENTION COMMITTEES

- I. The following Convention Committees, consisting of clergymen and lay person, shall be appointed by the President:
 - A. Arrangements
- Resolutions
- B. Rules of Order
- D. E. Dispatch of Business

C. Elections

- F. To Certify Minutes
- II. The President, Vice-President, and Secretary of the Convention shall be members, ex-officio, of all Convention Committees.
- III. The Convention Committees shall be empowered to take appropriate action prior to, and during, the next Annual Convention, as well as any special Convention held during their year of appointment.

Arrangements

- IV. The Committee on Arrangements shall be responsible for receiving post convention recommendations, and from such recommendations to make referrals in the following areas:
- $\,$ A. To the Ecclesiastical Authority recommendations pertaining to location, date and length of sessions.
- B. To the Committee on Rules of Order recommendations pertaining to the legislative procedure.
- C. To the Committee on Elections recommendations pertaining to nomination and election procedure.
- D. To the Committee on Resolutions recommendations pertaining to the resolution procedure.
- E. To the Committee on Dispatch of Business recommendations pertaining to the agenda and calendar of business.

The Committee shall recommend to the Diocesan Council the procedures and arrangements for the Pre-Convention meeting of Deputies, and shall be responsible for all physical arrangements of the Convention.

Rules of Order

V. The Committee on Rules of Order shall be responsible for the Rules of Order.

Elections

- VI. The Committee on Elections shall be responsible for the following nomination and election procedures at the Annual Convention:
- A. The Secretary of the Convention shall send out in the Call, the time and place of the Convention, a list and job description of the offices to be filled by election, the names of the incumbents of these offices, and an official nomination form. This Call shall be sent out at least one hundred (100) days before the date of Convention to each clerical member of the Convention, and to each Lay Deputation whose certificate has been transmitted to the Secretary, as provided in Canon 1. The call shall be printed in THE NEWARK CHURCHMAN.
- B. Any member of the Convention desiring to make nominations for any office or offices to be filled by Convention, shall, at least seventy-five (75) days before the date of Convention, submit the same in writing to the Secretary on the official nomination form. The nominator shall also furnish on the official nomination form the nominee's qualifications for the office sought.
- C. The Committee, from the list of nominations as furnished to it by the Secretary, shall prepare sufficient ballots marked "Sample" for each Clerical and Lay Deputy entitled to a seat in the Convention. These "sample" ballots together with the nominee's qualifications in a form to be prescribed by the Committee on Elections shall be mailed by the Secretary to each Deputation at least forty-five (45) days before the date of the Convention.
- D. If there be any office for which no nomination has been made on the "sample" ballot, any Deputy may file with the Secretary the name of one candidate for any such office on the official nomination form. Such nominations may be filed up to twenty-one (21) days before the date of the Convention. The Committee shall announce the names of such nominees prior to the distribution of the official ballot.
- E. At the beginning of the opening session the Committee shall report to the Convention in the form of an official ballot the names of the nominees. The arrangement of such names shall be determined by lot in each order.
- F. After each list of nominees as many blank spaces shall be left as there are vancancies to be filled. These blanks are provided so that any voter may use them for a "write-in" vote.
- G. Only official ballots may be used in elections, except when otherwise ordered by the Convention. Since the number of vacancies to be filled shall be printed on each ballot, no vote shall be counted in its class on which more names are marked than there are vacancies to be filled. Blank ballots shall not be counted in the whole number of votes cast.

Resolutions

- VII. The Committee on Resolutions shall be responsible for receiving all resolutions except those presented by Standing Committees and special bodies of this Convention.
- A. All resolutions to be considered for action by the Annual Convention shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Convention in writing and signed by a Deputy not less than seventy-five (75) days before the date of Convention. Resolutions should be submitted on white 8-1/2 by 11 paper, typed and double-spaced, in a standard form of three clear sections: the "whereas", dealing with the resolution background, the "resolved", naming the action desired, and the "further resolved", providing for the implementation of the resolution if adopted. After the expiration of seventy-five (75) day deadline the Secretary shall transmit to the Committee all resolutions submitted to him.
- B. The Committee shall collate all resolutions dealing with obviously similar subjects and will invite the submitters to meet and discuss such collation.
- C. The Committee shall submit its report to the Secretary sixty (60) days before the date of Convention with its recommendation for action upon each resolution as proposed or as amended or collated by the Committee. This report shall be mailed by the Secretary to each Deputation at least forty-five (45) days before the date of Convention.
- D. Resolutions will be permitted from the floor only when they carry a clear statement in writing of the emergency that leads to the request for their consideration and only by a two-thirds vote.

Dispatch of Business

VIII. The Committee on Dispatch of Business shall be responsible for the Calendar of Business. The Committee shall always be entitled to the floor on business pertaining to that Committee.

To Certify Minutes

IX. At the close of Convention a Committee shall be appointed to review and certify the correctness of the minutes.

ON DECORUM AND DEBATE

- X. Except when in conflict with the Constitution or Canons or any Rule herein contained, the latest edition of "Robert's Rules of Order" shall govern the interpretation of these rules and the procedure to follow.
- XI. No motion shall be considered as before Convention unless seconded, and, when required by the President, reduced to writing and signed by the mover, whose name shall be entered on the *JOURNAL*.

- XII. When any member is about to speak, he shall, with due respect, address himself to the President, and in speaking confine himself strictly to the point in debate.
- XIII. No member shall speak more than twice in the same debate without leave of the Convention (except the mover, who is entitled to reply).
- XIV. If any member in speaking or action transgresses the rules of the Convention, the President shall call him to Order, and he shall immediatly take his seat, unless permitted by the Convention to explain or proceed in order.
- XV. The following motions shall have priority in order listed. The mover cannot interrupt a member who has the floor.
 - must be recognized, and
 - the motion must be seconded
 - A. To Adjourn or To Recess
 Not debatable majority vote
 - B. To Lay on Table or To Table
 Not debatable majority vote

 Not debatable two-thirds vote
 - I. To Divide the Question Not debatable - majority vote
 - J. To Reconsider (must be made on day the vote is taken)
 - 1. Must be moved and seconded by ones who voted in majority
 - 2. Debatable two-thirds vote

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

- XVI. On motion duly moved and adopted, the Convention may go into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of any matter. The President shall designate some member of the Convention to act as Chairman of the Committee, which, when in session, shall be governed by these rules.
- A. A motion to rise and to report to the Convention, with or without leave to sit again, may be made at any time, and shall take precedence of all other motions, and shall be decided without debate. No such motion once made shall be renewed until further proceeding shall have taken place in the Committee.

- B. A Motion that a vote be taken at some designated time may be made and be disposed of without debate at any time, but as before provided a motion to report to the Convention shall take precedence.
 - C. No motion to lay on the table shall be entertained.

REPORTS

- XVII. No printed matter of any kind shall be distributed at the Convention or placed on the seats except by the authority of the President or Secretary.
- XVIII. All reports shall be in writing, and when made shall be the property of the Convention without any motion for acceptance. All reports recommending Convention action shall be accompanied by a resolution to that effect.
- XIX. Reports when submitted in Convention shall be read by title only unless the reading be for the better transaction of business.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTIONS

The Committee on elections for the 102nd Diocesan Convention has met and performed its prescribed duties in accordance with the 1975 rules of order.

It is the recommendation of the committee that the voting procedures adopted in 1975 be continued at this convention.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMISSION ON CLERGY SALARIES

On motion by the Rev. Hayward Levy, Chairman, the following report was received and the included resolutions adopted:

This Commission has been charged with three major responsibilities:

- 1. Thorough annual study of clergy remuneration in the Diocese.
- 2. Official report to the Convention regarding this study.
- Offering of recommendations to the Convention regarding clergy salaries and related considerations.

This Commission has no power to enforce standards adopted or mandates issued by Diocesan Convention.

PROPOSALS FOR 1977

Although the rate of inflation seems at last to be abating, prices are still rising and purchasing power is still eroding. Furthermore, there is no assurance, nor is there any expectation, that the end is in sight. During the past year, from October 1974 through October 1975 (the latest figure available at this writing) the cost of living in this area increased 6.2 per cent, according to data of the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Over the past three years, the rise has been 27.6 per cent.

Yet during that three-year period the Convention's mandated percentage increases in minimum cash stipends total 19.5 per cent. Clergy salaries have not kept pace even if allowance is made for the fact that some items that enter into the cost of living (such as housing and utilities) are provided the clergy in the form of non-monetary compensation.

(According to computer print-outs for 1974 from the Church Pension Fund, median salaries in the Diocese of Newark are 7th highest of the 93 diocese of the Episcopal Church, but when the area cost of living adjustments are calculated, Newark ranks 50th of the 93.) (See NEWARK CHURCHMAN, June 1975, p.1)

Some years ago, the Standing Commission on Clergy Salaries recommended that the Diocese should move beyond effords merely to keep up with the cost of living increases and direct every effort toward the establishment of "just and equitable" salary scales. This still remains a goal toward which we are striving. But the erratic ecomomic conditions of recent years heve focused most attention on efforts merely to keep up—or almost keep up—with spiraling inflation.

The scales recommended below are MINIMUM SCALES, representing cash stipends which no ordained clergyman should be expected to function in a full time position. A minimum scale is not necessarily a reasonable, fair or equitable remuneration. WE STRONGLY URGE ALL GOVERNING BOARDS TO TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION SUCH FACTORS AS THEIR MINISTER'S TRAINING, EXPERIENCE, DEDICATION, SUPERVISORY FUNCTIONS, EFFECTIVENESS, PERFORMANCE AND FAMILY RESPONSIBILITES, AS WELL AS THE SIZE, EXPECTATION AND RESOURCES OF THE SPECIFIC CONGREGATION. These are minimum scales. No figures below are to be misconstrued as representing maximum salaries.

RESOLUTION 1

WHEREAS the Convention's mandated increases in minimum salaries for clergymen of the Diocese of Newark in recent years have been well below the increase in the cost of living for this area as reported in official government indices; and

WHEREAS the projected cost of living increase in 1976 will continue the erosion of purchasing power;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the 102nd Convention of the Diocese of Newark adjust minimum salary scales at all levels for 1977 to effect an increase of 7% over corresponding scales adopted for 1976, as indicated below:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all increments due to age or length of service shall, in fact, become effective at the beginning of the fiscal year following the date upon which the clergyman becomes eligible for such increases either by reason of length of service or age; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in addition to the appropriate cash salary, all clergy shall continue to receive standard allowances and perquisites established by previous Conventions, as follows:

- (a) Suitable housing, properly maintained
- (b) Heat
- (c) Electricity
- (d) Water
- (e) Gas (if necessary)
- (f) Local telephone service, if required for parish purposes
- (g) Auto allowance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Convention continue the policy established in 1970 that all clergy receiving minimum cash salaries shall receive the additional sum of \$100 per year per dependent child (as defined by I.R.S. regulations), up to a limit of four (4) childred; and that these allowances be treated as regular salary in establishing disbursement schedules.

RESOLUTION II

BE IT RESOLVED that this Convention recommend that in cases where clergymen currently are receiving a salary above 1976 minimum standards, they likewise receive a salary increase of 7%, such salary increase to be effective January 1, 1977.

RESOLUTION III

WHEREAS the operation of an automobile is required in the work of the church and expenses relating to said operation are considered church responsibility rather than an iten to be underwritten personally by the clergyman; and

WHEREAS the cost of acquiring and maintaining an automobile has risen substantially since the current minimum allowance of \$1450 per year was established by 1975 Convention:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the minimum automobile allowance be increased from \$1450 to \$1600 per year.

RELATED CONSIDERATIONS

Continuing Education

Reminder is hereby offered that the 99th Convention of the Diocese of Newark approved by a virtually unanimous vote a resolution to implement on the local level the continuing education of the clergy. The 1973 action proposed that an annual sum of \$200 and one week's official leave with pay be made available to each clergyman by the local congregation served. (For approved programs requiring additional funds or time, the benefits may be accumulated for a period not to exceed four (4) years.)

At the adoption of the above report to Rev. Phillip Watters, St. Mark's, Mendham, requested that the Standing Committee include in future recommendations a figure requesting equitable computation of an allowance or mileage to be accorded any clergyman using a car owned by the congregation.

- 3) Each speaker shall be limited to two minutes, and no speaker shall speak more than once on the same question.
- 4) To the extent possible, the Chair shall recognize speakers of opposite views in alternate succession.
- 5) Each Function of the Budget shall be presented and debated separately. Ten minutes shall be allotted for discussion and debate of each Function.
- 6) Only motions to amend the Function under discussion and motions to amend any amendment of the Function under discussion shall be entertained until all three Functions have been discussed and debated.
- 7) Any amendment that would increase a proposed appropriation must include a proposed source of funding for the increase.
- 8) A maximum of fifteen minutes shall be allowed for discussion of the Resolution and no motion to lay on the table, or otherwise to terminate debate on the Resolution, shall be entertained during this period, or until no other member desires to speak to the Resolution, whichever shall first occur.
- 9) The Resolution as finally accepted by the Convention then shall be considered and adopted as a unit.

- Any amendment that would increase a proposed appropriation must include a proposed source of funding for the increase.

- by other extraordinary means (excluding cuts in the program budget).

The Right Reverend the Bishop of Newark 1ed the Convention in its Noonday prayers.

The Bishop extended the greetings of the Rev. Paul Stagg, Executive Director of the N.J. Council of Churches to the Convention.

The Rev. James Waring, Chairman, read the report of the Commission on Evangelism.

Mrs. Marjorie Christie, President of the Episcopal Churchwomen, read the Annual Report.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS (continued)

POSSIBILITIES OF A UNIFIED BUDGET AND A VOLUNTARY SYSTEM OF DIOCESAN FINANCE TO BE EXPLORED

On motion by Mr. Henry Franzoni, the following resolution submitted by the North Essex Convocation, was adopted:

WHEREAS we believe that Christian giving happens in response and gratitude to God for all He has given us and that Jesus taught us that giving to others should have first priority and that the Biblical standard is a proportionate and sacrificial share of our time, talent and treasurer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this 102nd Annual Convnetion of the Diocese of Newark direct the Diocesan Council to explore the possibilities of adopting a unified diocesan budget and a plan of voluntary support of the financial obligations of the diocese, including ECUSA, whereby the necessity of Assessments and Quotas could be eliminated.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Diocesan Council report its finding with its recommendations to the convocations for study, four months before the 103rd Annual Convention and to the 103rd Annual Convention for adoption.

ABORTION RIGHTS

On motion, the following substitute resolution for one originally submitted by the Department of Christian Social Relations, submitted by the Rev. Phillip C. Cato, was adopted with amendment:

WHEREAS the procreation of human life, involving a man and a women, participates in the creative processes of God Himself, and

WHEREAS within the community of faith the decision to terminate a pregnancy so created ought not be made on a purely individual basis and without regard to the accumulated wisdom of the Christian Church, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that this 102nd Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark strongly encourage those of its members faced with such a decision to seek counsel from their clergy as well as from medical advisors and other trusted councellors in order that they may make a responsible decision and satisfy the demand of Christian conscience, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this 102nd Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark express its unequivocal opposition to any attempt by the State to abridge or deny the right of persons to make such an informed decision and to act upon it.

SUPPORT OF FARM WORKERS

On motion by Mr. Donald B. Roberts, deputy from the Church of Our Saviour, Secaucus, a substitute for a resolution originally submitted by the Department of Christian Social Relations was adopted as follows:

WHEREAS the American worker has benefited through organization into unions for the purpose of collective bargaining: and

WHEREAS the General Convention of the Episcopal Church held in Louisville, Kentucky, in 1973 resolved to "support and actively work for passage of state and federal legislation that will bring agricultural workers under the jurisdiction of the National Labor Relations Act," in order to provide for secret ballot elections, and to make fair and effective collective bargaining possible in agriculture;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the One Hundred and Second Convention of the Diocese of Newark call on the people of the Diocese of Newark to support such legislation in the State of New Jersey and the U.S. Congress and also to be supportive of all agricultural workers, and especially those in the State of New Jersey who elect to associate themselves in union for their mutual benefit.

THE AUTOMATIC PENSION FUND

The income received on this fund is annually divided among those Clergymen who:

(a) have attained the age of sixty-five years and have notified the Trustees of that fact prior to May first of the year in question; and

(b) were canonically resident in the Diocese for the five years immediately preceding such notification; and

(c) were for at least five years of their last term of canonical residence settled Ministers or Missionaries duly appointed by the Ecclesiastical Authority; and

(d) have retired on account of age or disability.

FUND FOR THE RELIEF OF CLERGYMEN AND THEIR DEPENDENTS
The Trustees shall at their discretion annually as of May 1st appropriate the
estimated income of the Fund for:

(a) the relief of disabled Clergymen canonically resident in the Diocese;

(b) the relief of the widows and children and the defraying of the funeral expenses of deceased Clergymen who were canonically resident in the Diocese at the time of their demise.

Unappropriated income shall at the discretion of the Trustees be reserved as a contingency fund for the foregoing purposes or may be added to the principal of the Fund.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1975

There were nine meetings of the Standing Committee held during 1975.

JANUARY 29th

Consent was granted to St. George's Church, Maplewood, to sell the rectory.

The Rev. James A. Basinger was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Priesthood.

Approval was given to expenditures by the Bishops during the year 1974 from funds as follows: Jesse Williams, \$9,901.54; Hannibal Goodwin, \$6,506.96; Church Aid Society, \$7,361.07.

Consent was given to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. William Augustus Jones, Jr. as Bishop of the Diocese of Missouri; to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. Robert Campbell Witcher as Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of Long Island.

Ms. Martha Blacklock was recommended to the Bishop for acceptance as a Candidate for Holy Orders.

The Rev. Abigail Painter was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Priesthood subject to the Canons.

MARCH 12th

The Rev. Dale Cranston was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the $\mbox{\sc Priesthood}.$

The following resolution was approved for presentation to the 101st Annual Convention:

WHEREAS, the Rt. Rev. George Edward Rath, S.T.D., has requested the 101st Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark to give consent and approval to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the said Diocese by reason of the extent of Diocesan work,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this lolst Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark gives its consent and approval to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for said Diocese; and

That the consents to such election be, and the same hereby are requested from the Bishops having jurisdiction in the United States and from the several Standing Committees, and that all further requirements set forth in the Canons be complied with to put in force the purpose and intents of this resolution; and

That upon obtaining the necessary consents and compliance with the requirements of the Canons, the Bishop be, and hereby is, authorized to call a Special Session of the Convention for the election of such Coadjutor.

The Standing Committee advised that a resolution be prepared for presentation to the Diocesan Convention calling for the appointment of a Committee on the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor.

Consent was given to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the Diocese of Southern Virginia; to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the Diocese of West Texas; to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. William Hawley Clark as Bishop of the Diocese of Delaware; to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. William Arthur Dimmick as Bishop of the Diocese of Northern Michigan; to the ceding of certain portions of the territory presently included in the Diocese of Southeast Florida to the Diocese of Southwest Florida.

APRIL 9th

The Standing Committee recommended to the Bishop that he proceed with the organization of a Mission of the Episcopal Church as part of the Panther Valley Ecumenical Mission.

The Rev. Nancy Hatch Wittig was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Priesthood subject to the Canons.

It was recommended to the Bishop that Dr. Nathan Wright, Jr. be restored to the Ministry.

MAY 21st

The following were elected as officers of the Standing Committee: President, the Rev. S. Hughes Garvin; Secretary, the Rev. William H. Strain.

The Rev. Henry Powers, Class of 1975, was not re-elected by the Diocesan Convention. The Standing Committee passed a resolution expressing appreciation to Mr. Powers for his conscientious service to the Standing Committee as a member for the past decade and as secretary for most of that time.

Messrs. Robert J. Schoen and Bradley R. Thayer were re-elected as members of the Board of Trustees of the Diocesan Investment Trust.

The Diocesan Council, at its meeting on April 14, 1975, had considered the matter of the appointment of a Committee for the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor and stated its belief that the Standing Committee was the logical group to appoint such a Committee. The Standing Committee agreed to accept this responsibility. The following Nominating Committee was appointed: Mesdames Kuhl and Gilman; Messrs. Hart and Wachenfeld.

 $\mbox{\rm Mr.}$ D. Lorne Coyle was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Diaconate.

Consent was given to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. Richard A. Abellon as Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of the Northern Philippines.

JUNE 11th

Messrs. Fred Magnuson, James Delaney, and William Berlin were recommended to the Bishop for acceptance as Candidates for Holy Orders for the Perpetual Diaconate.

Permission was given to St. Matthew's, Paramus, to incorporate as a parish.

Consent was given to sell the parish house and rectory which had belonged to Christ Church, Newark.

Consent was given to Grace Church, Westwood, to sell property at 226 Roosevelt Avenue and 21 Harrington Avenue, Westwood.

Fifteen, rather than twelve, were elected to the Committee for the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor so that all District Convocations might be represented.

There was considerable discussion concerning the large number of applicants seeking admission as Candidates for Holy Orders looking toward the Perpetual Diaconate. Consideration of this matter will continue.

The Rev. Page Bigelow was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Priesthood, subject to the Canons.

Consent was given to the Diocese of Dallas to elect a Suffragan Bishop.

SEPTEMBER 10th

The Rev. Richard DeMott, a Presbyterian minister, and the Rev. Richard Kukowski, a Roman Catholic priest, are applying for admission into the Episcopal ministry. No recommendation was made at this meeting but the applications will be reviewed in 1976.

The Standing Committee passed a resolution honoring the Rt. Rev. Kenneth Anand, Assistant Bishop of this Diocese, who died on July 27, 1975.

A report was made of the response to the request of the Standing Committee for consent to elect a Bishop Coadjutor as follows: from the Church's 110 Dioceses and Missionary Districts replies were received from 85, all granting consent; from the Church's 114 Bishops replies were received from 103, all granting consent.

Consent was granted to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. John Bowen Coburn as Bishop of the Diocese of Massachusetts and to the Diocese of Michigan to elect a Suffragan Bishop.

A special meeting to discuss the Perpetual Diaconate with members of the Commission on Ministry was set for October 1st.

OCTOBER 15th

Consent was given to St. Paul's, Hoboken, to sell the former rectory.

Consent was given to Trinity, Paterson, to sell property at 87 Marion Street, Paterson.

Acting as a Council of Advice to the Bishop, the Standing Committee passed a resolution requesting Bishop Rath to drastically cut back his commitments between now and next June. This action was taken because of the death of Bishop Anand and in view of the fact that it will be nine months before a Bishop Co-adjutor can be consecrated, making this a time of terrific pressure for Bishop Rath.

Consent was given to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. Robert E. Terwilliger as Suffragan Bishop of the Diocese of Dallas; to the election of the Rt. Rev. Scott Field Bailey as Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of West Texas; to the Diocese of Texas to elect a Suffragan Bishop, and to the Diocese of Arizona to elect a Bishop Coadjutor.

A questionnaire submitted by the Episcopal Study Committee on Preparation for the Ministry had been completed by members of the Standing Committee and special consideration was given to various issues.

NOVEMBER 12th

Consent was given to St. Barnabas', Newark, to lease the rectory and parish house to "Rectory, Inc." a school for the training and care of emotionally disturbed children. The lease is for the term of five years and was approved by the attorneys for the Standing Committee. This Consent is subject to the approval of the Department of Missions, since St. Barnabas' is an aided parish.

 $\mbox{Mr.}$ Robert Smith was recommended to the Bishop for acceptance as a Candidate for Holy Orders.

The Rev. Messrs. D. Lorne Coyle and Geoffrey B. Curtiss were recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Priesthood.

 $\mbox{\rm Mr.}$ William Berlin was recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Perpetual Diaconate.

The Standing Committee declared a moratorium on the approval of any future candidates for the Perpetual Diaconate pending conclusion of a study of the Perpetual Diaconate now being undertaken.

Consent was given to the ordination and consecration of the Rev. Robert Hume Cochrane as Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of Olympia and to the election of the Rt. Rev. William Moultrie Moore, Jr. as Bishop of the Diocese of Easton.

DECEMBER 10th

Messrs. James William Delaney and Fred C. Magnuson, Jr., were recommended to the Bishop for ordination to the Perpetual Diaconate.

There was considerable discussion concerning procedures to be followed in considering applicants for the ministry. Joint meetings with the Commission on Ministry have been held on this subject and further study is planned.

Consent was given to St. Paul's, Montvale, to mortgage a residence being purchased for a new rectory.

 $\mbox{Mr.}$ Richard J. Watts was recommended to the Bishop for acceptance as a Candidate for Holy Orders.

Consent was given to the election of the Rt. Rev. Morgan Porteus as Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese of Connecticut.

TO: The Members of the 1976 Diocesan Convention

FROM: Archdeacon Grant

Tragedy visited the clergy fellowship of the Diocese and Department of Missions in 1975. In May the Rev. Franklyn Weiler died suddenly after a brief illness. Then in July we received news from Pakistan that without warning the Right Rev. Kenneth Anand, our Assistant Bishop and Vicar of the Church of the Transfiguration, Towaco, died after celebrating and receiving the Sacrament. "May they go from strength to strength in the life of perfect

service.

The press of present problems in the areas of finances, aided parish and mission performance evaluations, and future development of the best use of clergy deployment, involving the start-up of part-time ministries, continuation of week-end ministries, and the move toward linking congregations under one priest, helped to speed up the two year process of real reorganization under the guidance of Consultation/Search of Cambridge, Massachusetts. June of 1975 saw the issuing of our manual called "Organization Concept" in which is laid out the formation of our four Disciplines - Finance, Property, Program, and Personnel - with each having supporting policies and procedures. More than ever, we now have greater membership involvement in data collecting, parochial liaison work, and review and decision making.

We are now able to facilitate analysis of the uses of the properties involved. Suggestions for ministry in the several communities as well as to the members of the congregations, now have more validity because of the wider base of information available.

The two meetings of the clergy of the missions and aided parishes called by Bishop Rath, studied in depth the problems of the clergy and congregations on the urban, suburban, and rural areas. These "Missioners Meetings" will continue. Much good has come of them, and we all look forward to a greater sense of collegiality, cooperative planning and goal setting, and diocesanwide sharing in the impact the Episcopal Church can make in the North Jersey community.

After two years of operating within the strict limits of the Diocesan Council's oversight by working with the Congregational Life and Development Planning Group, it was felt early on in 1975 by the Diocesan Council that greater effectiveness in Department operations as well as greater controls in fiscal matters would obtain by returning to the method of granting a block of Share money to the Department for its distribution to congregations. This procedure assures a freer exercise of self-determination in our research of individual congregations so that our analysis in each case brings to the fore a broader sense of responsibility and accountability both in the Department as well as in the aided congregations.

It should be noted that the aided congregations really do exist on survival budgets of operating costs below the Diocesan average (roughly \$28,000 vs \$40,000). This has meant that each year these congregations generally have increased local income and cut out some program expenses. What is seen in their budgets is the attempt to combat inflated costs of fuel, the constant pressure of capital debts, the increased costs of salary, pension, and car allowance items, while at the same time the people of the Diocese as a whole have been decreasing their Missionary (or Program) dollars. As the summary here attached demonstrates - more local mission dollars plus Department reserve dollars meant less Diocesan dollars.

With what I do pray is a resurgence of missionary spirit and fervor on the part of the people of the Diocese of Newark, the bold new ministries, the diligent spread of the joys of our faith, and the coming alive once again of courageous Christian confidence will spur us all to greater giving to the necessity of the saints.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Christ Church, Newark, was sold by the Trustees of the Episcopal Fund and Diocesan Properties.
- St. Agnes', East Orange, after an in-depth study by the Bishop and the Department, was granted \$3,000 by the Department so that the congregation could obtain a part-time clergyman. The experiment will be reviewed in February, 1976.
- St. Matthew's, Paramus, celebrated its 25th Anniversary by taking steps toward parish status.
- St. James', Hackettstown, began a fund raising drive to underwrite the cost of extensive renovations to the church and vicarage.
- Panther Valley, a new mission (as yet unnamed) was organized by Bishop Rath on Sunday, May 11th. This group is part of the ecumenical venture begun several years ago with the Presbyterian, Methodist, and United Church of Christ partners.
- The Church of The Saviour, Denville, received a grant of \$5,000 toward the \$23,000 cost of repairing and refinishing the ceiling in the church.
- St. Peter's, Mt. Arlington. The newly enlarged and renovated Parish Hall (cost, \$40,690) was dedicated by Archdeacon Grant on Sunday, October 19th.
- St. Barnabas', Newark. A new project called "The Rectory, Inc." has been set up to provide a house for emotionally disturbed children. Assisting will be the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry Mental Health Center.
- Grace, Van Vorst, Jersey City. The escalating problems largely in the area of property maintenance and program are under a continuing study by the Department.
- The Rev. Franklyn Weiler resigned as Vicar of the Church of the Incarnation, West Milford, but remained as priest-in-charge of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Ringwood, until his sudden death on May 17, 1975.

- The Rev. Clarence Searles was appointed Deacon-in-Charge of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Ringwood, by Bishop Rath on December 17, 1975.
- The Rev. Peter Van Ness was appointed Vicar of the Church of the Incarnation, West Milford, by Bishop Rath on August 16, 1975.
- The Rev. Peter Boyle resigned as Vicar of the Church of Our Saviour, Secaucus, as of January 1, 1976, but remains as part-time priest at St. James', Newark. He also serves part-time at the Holly Center of Youth Consultation Service in Hackensack.

In each year, the difference between the total Department budget and the amount received from Diocesan Council program money was made up from Department reserves. It can be seen that despite increased costs in each subsidized congregation by reason of increased salary, pension, and car amounts plus the universal cost of inflation, both congregations and the Department of Missions have been able to keep expenditures nearly level.

THE CHURCH PENSION FUND

This year's benefit total, shown above, represents annual benefits being paid by the Fund as of October 31, 1975, and is a 4.6% increase over last year's figure.

As in the past, we provide a brief summary of the Fund's operation during the past year. Financially, the year was a good one, with assets showing a \$30 million growth over the previous year. Additionally, the Fund's expense rate dropped slightly from last year to .39%.

Church Life Insurance Corporation and The Church Insurance Company - two of the Fund's affiliates - continued to provide high quality economical insurance protection to the Church, and both companies again paid dividends to the Fund, increasing its pool of resources from which benefits are derived.

A third affiliate, The Church Hymnal Corporation published two new booklets: Hymnal Supplement II, which is a musical up-dating of some of the present Hymnal texts, and Church Hymnal Series I, which contains settings for the Common Text of The Eucharist.

The benefits of membership are available to clergymen of the Protestant Episcopal Church who are not over fifty years of age and who have been canonically and actually resident as clergymen in the State of New Jersey for not less than three years and who can supply a medical certificate attesting to their good health. The annual dues are twelve dollars. If a Contributor is voted in after November 1 and before the end of the fiscal year, April 30th, his contribution shall be reduced to \$6.00 for that period.

Annual Meetings of the Corporation are held on the first Monday in June of each year, and the Executive Committee meetings at the call of the President.

Applications for membership as a Contributor are acted upon by the Executive Committee as soon as they are received, up to thirty days before the Annual Meeting, others at the Annual Meeting. With membership limited at the present time to 120, there were 115 contributors listed at the time of the Annual Meeting. Application blanks and other information can be obtained from the Secretary, 7 Becker Avenue, Rochelle Park, New Jersey, 07662.

At the Annual Meeting held on June 2, 1975, in Trenton, in the 178th year of the Corporation, the Treasurer reported assets of \$316,550.04 and receipts of \$28,366.88, from which annuities of \$4,687.50 were divided among 45 widows and 6 minor children, and the amount of \$175.00 was distributed out of surplus income to all widows and monor children entitled thereto, with one-fourth of this amount paid to those entitled thereto, as provided by the Fundamental Laws of the Corporation.

The next Annual Meeting will be held in Newark on Monday, June 7, 1976.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF CHRIST HOSPITAL COUNCIL

1975

As was the case a year ago, the President's Report for 1975 is rather an expression of his thanks and appreciation than a record of changes and accomplishments in the administration of Christ Hospital. This record is admirably stated in the Report of the Executive Director, which you will hear shortly.

As I look back upon the year, what impresses me most is the spirit of the teamplay and cooperation that has been demonstrated. Christ Hospital has always been known for a kind of "plus" in the concern of its staff in the care of our patients. Even when our buildings and their physical equipment were less than desired, the human quality of the care given our patients has been of the highest order. During 1975, I have felt a significant increase in the concern of the members of the Council, the administration, and the staff for one another.

The active participation of members of the Medical Staff in the affairs and the decisions of the Council is one evidence of this growing spirit of teamplay. Another is the relationship between the Council and the Executive Director and his assistants. And yet another is the increasing involvement of the members of the Council in the affairs of Christ Hospital. Year by year, this involvement seems to include more and more individuals at all levels of the Council, administration, and staff.

In our plans for a new and more adequate facility, we are by no means at the beginning of the end, but we may be, in Winston Churchill's phrase, at the end of the beginning. Much remains to be done, and it will require a still deeper commitment than we have shown thus far on the part of everyone of us to bring our dream to fulfillment so as to provide the best possible care for the people for whose health we are responsible. If there has been any disappointment in the past, it has been the failure, not only of industry, business, and the community-at-large to respond significantly to our appeal for help in building new facilities, but also the failure of the members of the Council and Medical Staff to commit their own financial resources. Proportionately speaking, those who have given most have been those who had least to give, members of the maintenance staff and others.

I am convinced, nonetheless, that, as our plans mature and the actual construction begins many who have given only token support, if that, will be led to commit themselves more deeply. Christ Hospital, in the century and more of its existence, has never failed to respond to the needs of the people of its community. I do not and cannot believe that we shall fail now.

CHRIST HOSPITAL - JERSEY CITY REPORT TO THE 102ND ANNUAL DIOCESAN CONVENTION February 7, 1976

Christ Hospital has continued during the past year to minister in our Lord's Name to the sick and the injured of Hudson County. Over 12,000 patients were admitted to the hospital during 1975 while almost 27,000 patients were treated in the emergency room and the clinics. The spiritual needs of the patients were met by the Rev. William Stocks, our Chaplain, and through referral of patients to clergy of other denominations.

The Ecumenical ministry has been emphasized at Christ Hospital by Bishop Rath, president of the hospital, through his appointments to the board of trustees. Bishop Rath appoints the clergy members of the board and, in addition to the Episcopal clergy, he has appointed clergy from the Roman Catholic, Methodist and Reformed Churches. Most recently, he appointed a rabbi to serve as a hospital trustee.

It is my pleasure to report to the members of this convention that significant progress was made in 1975 on the plans for the Bishop Stark Pavilion. The pavilion, which will house our new emergency rooms and our department of ambulatory medicine, is in the hands of our new architects. Plans for the pavilion are being drawn during this year and construction should begin during 1977. The pavilion will form a part of a major modernization program at the hospital. A certificate of need, granting approval for the Project from the State of New Jersey, is expected during the next few days. The parishes and missions of our diocese have helped with this project through the Bishop Stark Pavilion Fund. To date \$134,644. has been given to the fund and only \$4,053. is outstanding in pledges.

On behalf of all at the hospital, I want to thank you for your support, your encouragement and your prayers.

COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

REPORT TO THE 102ND ANNUAL DIOCESAN CONVENTION February 7, 1976

The Commission on Evangelism will be three years old this April. It is made up of 27 persons, a mixture of clergy and laity. Our emphasis until now has been mostly on "inreach", on personal renewal within the Diocese of Newark as we have sought to deepen our own commitment to Jesus Christ. The greatest need for mission, however, is in "outreach" amongst the 45-50% of the people in North Jersey who have no religious affiliation at all. So our work will be increasingly in the sharing of the Good News of our Lord with those on the outside. In this connection more than half of our rectors and vicars have designated lay leaders to head evangelism committees within their churches. Those who have not yet selected a leader are urged to do so and the Commission pledges to work with any parish in helping to get things started.

It is amazing how many varied evangelism events and activities have been held in the last 12 months. There was, of course, the major 4 day event in March 1975, with the Rev. Robert B. Hall, Executive Director of the Episcopal Center for Evangelism. In addition there were 3 workshops, a luncheon with Canon Ernest Southcott, evening gatherings with Mr. William Mudge, the Rev. Stewart Broughton and Bishop William Gordon, 4 prayer events with the Rev. Donald Hulstrand, and a day of spirtual renewal for the clergy with Bishop Festo Kivengere. We also now have a newsletter, "Sharing Joy", edited by Jan Houston, which is sent periodically to all clergy, evangelism lay leaders, and all others who request it.

Our major evangelism event for 1976, will be the 4 day visit to the Diocese of Bishop William Frey of Colorado. This dynamic spiritual leader will be with us March 10th-13th, speaking and teaching at 6 different churches on "The Lordship of Christ in the Home, Church and World". Then in May, from Thursday on the 6th through Saturday the 8th, the Bicentenial Prayer Conference will be held in Philadelphia with the Presiding Bishop, John Allin, as major speaker, and Senator Mark Hatfield of Oregon as keynoter. Make your reservation early for this important activity.

It is the prayer of our Commission that we may all be open to the power of the Holy Spirit, so Jesus Christ may truly be Lord in our lives and throughout the Diocese of Newark.

LITURGICAL COMMISSION REPORT DIOCESE OF NEWARK - 1975-1976

Compared to 1974 the work of the Liturgical Commission has moved along each month in a rather quiet manner. We cannot report the success of a venture as the Great Service of Thanksgiving at Seton Hall in November 1974.

We did sponsor the Liturgical Day for the Diocese on October 25, 1975 at Trinity Cathedral. The key-noters were Dr. Erik Rontley, Westminster Choir College and Dr. Thomas Talley, General Seminary. In the future we plan to do more grass-roots testing of local congregational needs before producing workshops and other days for liturgical growth.

The Commission has encouraged and supported the formation of an association of Church Musicians in the Diocese. We are happy to report that this association is now formed and functioning to develop inter-parish, ecumenical and diocesan growth in church music and fellowship among organists-choirmasters.

Gus Bittrick represented the Diocese of Newark at the annual meeting of Liturgical Commission Charimen in the Diocese of New Jersey. Members of the Commission are now producing regular monthly articles for the Newark Churchman on a variety of liturgical subjects. We make every effort to respond individually to communications from churchmen in the Diocese who express a variety of opinions regarding Prayer Book Revision. Presently we are working on the preparation and publishing of a Handbook for Music in the Church's Worship which will be ready for circulation in 1976.

The Bishop has participated in all of our deliberations and work, as we continue to assist him in his responsibility as the chief liturgical officer of the Diocese. During 1976 we shall function to help prepare for the Service of The Consecretion and Installation of the new Bishop-coadjutor.

We are all waiting for the publication of the final draft of the proposed Book of Common Prayer which will be presented to the General Convention in the Fall of 1976. We are grateful for the continuing dedication of those who have served and are now serving on the Commission.

EPISCOPAL CHURCHWOMEN

DIOCESE OF NEWARK Annual Report

A statement issued a few months ago by the United States Commission on Anglican Roman Catholic Consultation says in part:

"In both our churches there is a growing realization that women should have a more effective voice in all areas of church life, befitting their dignity as human persons made in the image and likeness of God."

Here in the Episcopal Diocese of Newark, I am happy to note, there has been for some time not only the growing realization but also a gradual acceptance of the varied contributions and ministries of women. The most recent statistics compiled from Episcopal Churchwomen President's Reports tell us that 21 of our parishes have women as wardens, 34 as treasurers; and that there are 324 women serving on vestries - this last an increase of 25 percent over last year and more than 40 per cent over only two years ago!

Of special interest is the fact that there are more than 80 women who are licensed lay readers, 5 who have been ordained, one who is to be ordained to the diaconate this spring, and a half dozen who are currently in seminary. The Bishop's men, a term I heard used to describe the "Second Seventy", proved to be somewhat of a misnomer since a goodly protion of the Seventy were women. When we add to all this the knowledge that women comprise 25 per cent of the membership of diocesan committees and commissions, there is reason to rejoice over the growing participation of women in most areas of church life. Let us pray and work for continued

What else have Episcopal Churchwomen been involved in this year - as individuals, as guilds, as members of the Executive Board, as Women of the Church? At the Fall conference in Morristown we examined, along with more than twenty of our Clergy brothers, The Changing World of Women and were encouraged to hear the workshop leaders tell of new paths and new emphasis in the fields of education, sociology, politics, and religion. We entered the Advent season by taking some time for spiritual reflection during our annual quiet morning at Trinity Cathedral. And last month in Pompton Lakes the ecumenical movement - or more precisely, the Anglican-Roman Catholic document on the Eurcharist - came alive for the people assembled there as a panel of two Episcopal priests and two Roman priests demonstrated the growing understanding of one another's heritage.

We look forward to the annual meeting and United Thank Offering ingathering this May heartened by the knowledge that an increased understanding of this unique and spontaneous giving to the mission of our Church exists not only in this diocese but all across the country. District meetings have highlighted the School of Religion, United Thank Offering grants and procedures, the boyhood of Jesus, team ministry, hymnody and ministry to the dying.

1975 marked the end of an era for one very special project of the Episcopal Churchwomen; "Little Joseph" -- not so little any more, but a young man of 17 who no longer needs our special attention. For the past twelve years women's organizations across this diocese have been including Joseph Jean-Paul in their budgets and have given more than \$15,000. during that time so that a small boy born without arms and legs might grow to adulthood confident in his ability to lead a normal life. Joe is fully grown now and no longer needs to make the trip to Kessler Institute so we've closed our books but not our memories of a valiant and courageous little boy.

We have contributed our time, our talent, our treasure in a wide variety of ways: \$103,000 to help with the day-to-day expenses of maintaining our parishes and missions and another \$55,000 for projects outside the parish in the diocese, the nation, and the world. The United Thank Offering ingatherings amounted to an additional \$30,000. The Executive Board has established a yearly contribution to the scholarship fund at St. Augustine's College in Raleigh, North Carolina, with the monies received as dividends from a bequest to the work of the Women of the Church. A memorial established in honor of past UTO chairman, Charlotte Blanchard, helped repair the roof at St. Vincent's School in Haiti, and the memorial established in honor of Sybil Shugg, beloved former Treasurer of the ECW, will provide a new frontal and vestments for the altar in the chapel at Cathedral House.

We have repeated last spring's League of Women Voters project by updating the information concerning nominee's points of view in preparation for the electing of our General Convention Alternates and have establised a new procedure of pledge cards to encourage wider support of the Diocesan ECW budget.

The Women of the Diocese have stated their purpose as

"joyfully witnessing for Christ, encouraging one another's ministries, helping to strengthen congregational life, and participating in the wider Church."

Or in the words of Susan Griffiths, President of the ECW some twenty years ago; " our fellowship is not composed of little islands of unrelated guilds and societies-- we are the Women of the Church united for the whole program of the whole Church."

A stole, burse, maniple and veil were given to the Rev. Fr. Utaegbulam of St. Agnes', East Orange.

A cross was given to St. Andrew's, Newark and a pyx to the Rev. J. Poulos of the Church of the Ascension, Jersey City.

Several money grants were given. \$100 for Bishop Anand Memorial Fund. \$25 to the Convent in memory of Sr. Waldina Luisa. \$50 to St. Margaret's Convent in Haiti, and \$100 to the National Association of Diocesan Altar Guilds, to help with Convention expenses.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF CONVENTION

The Secretary of the Convention presented the following report:

Notices were sent out in pursuance of the Constitution for the Special Convention now in session.

(CLERICAL DEPUTIES): (Having seat and voice, but no vote)

The Committee on Rules of Order for the Special Convention to Elect a Bishop Coadjutor, March 6, 1976, has met and performed the duties prescribed for it by the 101st Convention of the Diocese of Newark.

The Committee recommends the adoption of the Rules of Order as accepted by the 102nd Convention, with such special rules, where applicable, as given in the attached report and which have been circulated to all Deputies in both Clergy and Lay Orders.

THE DIOCESE OF NEWARK

PROPOSED RULES OF ORDER FOR SPECIAL CONVENTION MARCH 6, 1976

RULE I - DEPUTIES

- A. Deputies to the Electoral Convention on March 6, 1976, shall be seated by parish within districts. No person shall be admitted to the Convention floor without an identifying badge.
- B. Badges shall identify persons as

VOTING:

Blue - clergy

White - lay

NON-VOTING:

Orange - tellers

Green - marshalls

- C. Visitors shall be restricted to a specially designated area and shall wear a red badge.
- D. No deputy shall be issued a ballot on Saturday morning without presenting an identification badge. In the event of the loss of an identification badge and/or ballot, application for reissue may be made to the Secretary of Convention.

RULE II - NOMINATIONS

- A. The Committee on the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor, having been charged by the Diocesan Council to prepare and submit a slate of three or more candidates for election, shall report the result of its work to the Special Convention.
- B. Nominations shall then be made subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Any member of the Convention desiring to make nomination shall give in writing his/her name, parish, the name and written consent of the nominee, and the names and parishes of the proposed seconders to the Secretary of the Convention not later than thirty (30) minutes after the approval of these Rules of Order. No other nominations may be made until after the sixth ballot. After the sixth ballot verbal consent of the nominee will be acceptable.
 - There shall be only one nominating speech for each nominee. Should more than one person desire to make the nominating speech, the Chair shall consult with those persons involved to determine which person makes the speech.
 - 3. The nominating speeches for the candidates whose names appear in the report of the Committee on the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor shall be made first, in alphabetical order. The order of other nominating speeches shall then be determined by random selection.
 - Nominating speeches will be limited in length to five (5) minutes each.
 - 5. There will be no seconding speeches. Two seconders to the nomination are required and two only will be recognized to indicate support for the nomination. Seconders shall state their name and parish as they rise to second the nomination. Seconders shall not be from the same parish, nor shall either seconder be from the parish of the deputy making the nomination.

RULE III - CLOSING NOMINATIONS

A motion to close nominations shall not be in order until all members who shall have signified their intention to make a nomination as provided in Rule II have had an opportunity to do so. Thereafter, an affirmative vote of a majority of the deputies present and voting shall close nominations.

RULE IV - ADJOURNMENT OR RECESS

The Convention shall adjourn upon the election and certification of the Bishop Coadjutor or recess at 5 p.m., whichever comes earlier.

RULE V - REOPENING NOMINATIONS

Nominations may be made to the Convention between ballots at any time after the sixth ballot on request of twenty-five (25) members of the Convention. Members of the Convention who desire to make an additional nomination after the reopening may then do so by signifying their intention to the Chair. A motion to close nominations shall not be in order until all new nominations have been made.

RULE VI - CERTIFICATION OF THE ELECTION

No member of the Convention shall be excused until either the convention is recessed or the election is announced and the signature of each voting deputy is obtained for the Canonical Testimonial of the election. Deputies must sign before leaving.

RULE VII - APPOINTMENTS

The Chair shall appoint a marshall and sufficient aides to assure compliance with the rules of the Convention.

The Chair informed the Convention that under the provisions of Special Rule II B (1), any member of the Convention desiring to make a nomination had until 10:51 o'clock to notify the Secretary.

BISHOP'S COMMUNICATION

The Bishop's Communication was read by the Secretary of the Convention as follows:

My Sisters and my Brothers:

The 101st Annual Convention of the Diocese, meeting in Newark on May 10, 1975, gave its consent to my request for the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the Diocese of Newark by reason of the extent of Diocesan work. The Secretary of the Standing Committee will, I believe, be able to report that consents to the holding of such an election have been received from a majority of the Standing Committees of Dioceses in the United States and from a majority of the Bishops having jurisdiction in the United States.

Now, in accordance with the provisions of Title III, Canon 14, Section 2 (a) of the Canons of the Episcopal Church, I hereby give and cause to be read, to this Special Convention of the Diocese of Newark, convened at Newark on this sixth day of March, anno domini 1976, my written consent for such election, and herewith state the duties which I shall assign to the Bishop Coadjutor, when duly ordained and consecrated.

I shall assign him the jurisdiction and pastoral care over all applicants to be admitted Candidates for Holy Orders, a jurisdiction and care he will share with members of the Diocesan Commission on Ministry and The Standing Committee of the Diocese. He will also share with me the pastoral care of those already admitted as Candidates for Holy Orders.

I shall assign him a full and equal share in Confirmation and other parish visits.

I shall share with him the oversight of such Parishes as may become vacant and shall seek his advice and consent in the approval of the elections of Rectors by the Vestries of such Parishes, reserving to myself for the present the oversight of Missions and their Vicars.

I shall assign him oversight of several Departments, Commissions, Committees, and other agencies of the Diocese, depending upon his own special skills and interests.

He will have a full share with me in pastoral responsibility for the clergy of the Diocese and their families.

The Canon provides that "the duties assigned by the Bishop to the Bishop Coadjutor in any Diocese may be enlarged by mutual consent whenever the Bishop of the Diocese may desire to assign such additional duties to the Bishop Coadjutor." I have already put the prospective nominees for the office on notice that they will probably be assigned more responsibility than either they desire or deserve.

Pray, sisters and brothers, that God may lead us to the election of one who can undertake these responsibilities gladly and willingly and perform them creditably to the edification of his holy Church.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE

The Report of the Standing Committee was read by the President of the Standing Committee as follows:

To the Special Convention of the Diocese of Newark, March 6, 1976:

At a meeting of the Standing Committee held on Wednesday, March 12, 1975, at Cathedral House, 24 Rector Street, Newark, New Jersey, a majority of the members being present, Bishop Rath gave notice of his intention to ask the Convention of the Diocese to elect a Bishop Coadjutor by reason of the extent of Diocesan work. As a result of the Bishop's statement the following resolution was approved for presentation to the 101st Annual Convention:

"WHEREAS, the Rt. Rev. George Edward Rath, S.T.D., has requested the 101st Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark to give consent and approval to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the said Diocese by reason of the extent of Diocesan work.

"Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this 101st Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark gives its consent and approval to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor for said Diocese; and

"That the consents to such election be, and the same hereby are requested from the Bishops having jurisdiction in the United States and from the several Standing Committees, and that all further requirements set forth in the Canons be complied with to put in force the purpose and intents of this resolution; and

"That upon obtaining the necessary consents and compliance with the requirements of the Canons, the Bishop be, and hereby is, authorized to call a Special Session of the Convention for the election of such Coadjutor."

This resolution having been presented to the 101st Annual Convention on May 10, 1975, and adopted, letters to the Bishops and to the Standing Committees, asking for consent to the election of a Bishop Coadjutor on account of extent of Diocesan work, were signed by the Bishop of the Diocese and the Secretary of the Standing Committee and mailed to the one hundred and fourteen Bishops and one hundred and ten Standing Committees.

At a meeting of the Standing Committee held on Wednesday, September 10, 1975, the Secretary reported that consent to elect a Bishop Coadjutor had been received from a majority of the Bishops and Standing Committees, replies having been received from one hundred and three Bishops and eighty-five Standing Committees all granting consent.

Also, at its meeting on Wednesday, June 11, 1975, the Standing Committee appointed a Committee for the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor for the purpose of (1) preparing a profile of the Diocese, a profile of the Bishop Coadjutor to be elected, together with a job description and a contract outline, (2) establishing search procedures after investigating the experience of other diocese, (3) identifying candidates and interviewing them, and (4) preparing and submitting a slate of three or more candidates for election. In an effort to include representatives from as many of the Convocations and the major organizations of the diocese as possible, the following were appointed to the Committee for the Election of a Bishop Coadjutor:

MEMORANDUM OF INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE BISHOP AND THE STANDING COM-MITTEE OF THE DIOCESE OF NEWARK ON PETITION BY A PARISH TO SELL, LEASE OR MORTGAGE REAL ESTATE

- I. Title I, Canon 6, Sec. 3 of the General Church Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church provides that no Vestry shall encumber or alienate any real property without the written consent of the Bishop and Standing Committee of the Diocese.
- II. The Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (R.S. 16:12-4) provide as follows:

"No sale, conveyance or mortgage of any real estate other than burial lots in churchyards or cemeteries, and no lease for a longer term than one year shall be made by such corporation without the previous written consent of the Bishop and a majority of the Standing Committee of the Diocese within which the corporation is located ***. Without such consent the sale, conveyance, mortgage or lease shall be void."

III. In the discharge of the responsibilities placed upon them by canonical and civil law the Bishop and the Standing Committee have adopted the following rules and regulations with respect to selling, leasing and mortgaging real estate belonging to the parishes of this Diocese.

IV. Sell or Lease

No application to sell or lease real estate for more than one year will be entertained until the petitioner has filed the following documents in proper form with the Secretary of the Standing Committee:

- 1. A resolution by the Rector, Wardens and Vestry of the Parish authorizing the execution of the petition to sell or lease real estate.
- A petition which shall contain or be accompanied by supporting schedules containing the following:

- (a) A description of the property by metes and bounds.
- (b) Information as to whether the property has been consecrated.
- (c) Information as to whether the property is improved and if so the nature of any buildings thereon and their present use.
- (d) The reason or reasons for selling or leasing the property.
- (e) In the case of a sale, the terms and conditions of the sale, together with a statement of the intended disposition of the proceeds of the sale should be set forth.
- (f) In the case of a sale, the petition must be accompanied by a written appraisal of a qualified real estate appraiser.

V. Mortgage

No application to mortgage real estate will be entertained until the petitioner has filed the following documents in proper form with the Secretary of the Standing Committee:

- A resolution by the Rector, Wardens and Vestry of the Parish authorizing the execution of the petition to mortgage real estate.
- 2. A petition which shall contain or be accompanied by supporting schedules containing the following:
 - (a) A description of the property by metes and bounds.
 - (b) A statement of the size and terms of the mortgage including the interest rate, duration, amortization period and name of lending institution.
 - (c) A statement of the reasons why it is necessary to borrow the money secured by the mortgage, including the planning for the ultimate repayment of the amount borrowed.
 - (d) A brief income and operating statement of the Parish for the last two fiscal years showing sources of <u>income</u> including pledges, plate offerings, rental income, income

from investments, and the like; and expenses, including salaries and other operating expenses.

- (e) A statement that the Parish has met its Diocesan Quota for the previous three years; if not, the reasons therefor.
- (f) A statement of any other outstanding indebtedness.
- (g) A statement of the present parish membership showing the number of baptized persons and communicants as contrasted with comparable figures of 5 years ago.
- VI. The foregoing documents in proper form should be sent to the Secretary of the Standing Committee, 24 Rector Street, Newark, N. J. 07102, following which the petitioning parish will be advised of the manner in which the petition will be entertained. Normally correct petitions fully prepared and duly submitted to the Secretary of the Standing Committee will be sufficient for the Committee to take action. The Secretary of the Standing Committee shall notify the petitioning parish if it is necessary to appear to present the petition in person. Upon personal appearance before the Standing Committee, a petitioning Parish may request a waiver of any of the foregoing documents.
- VII. The Vestry of the petitioning Parish is cautioned to establish a date for closing the transaction which shall allow ample time for preparation of the petition and its accompanying schedules and the presentation thereof to the Bishop and the Standing Committee. It is suggested that the petition and its accompanying schedules be reviewed by counsel for the petitioner before the filing of the petition with the Standing Committee.
- VIII. Standard forms of resolution and petition will be supplied by the Secretary of the Standing Committee at 24 Rector Street, Newark, N. J. 07102, upon request.
