

Memory loss that disrupts everyday life is not a normal part of aging. This program explores the difference between normal age-related memory changes and abnormal changes that are associated with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia, including some of the common warning signs. The presentation also reviews the importance of receiving a thorough diagnostic evaluation when symptoms first arise, current treatment options, and research regarding healthy aging.

- · Research, develop, and submit for approval at the 145th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Newark a training program that will be required for all clergy, all lay persons elected to leadership in the Diocese, diocesan search committees, and that will be encouraged for use by all congregational search committees
- · Monitor and submit to each Diocesan Convention, beginning with the 145thConvention of the Diocese of Newark, a report on the status of women clergy in the Diocese in regards to role, pay equity, and gender-based harassment
 - · Submit this resolution to the 79thGeneral Convention of The Episcopal Church
