



MACRO Formation:



Ongoing life of the church

- worship, fellowship, teaching, service, witness
- lifelong, life-wide, life-deep
- metabolism of the community

MICRO Formation:



intentional bursts
of focused,
context-specific
faith intensification

MACRO +/- MICRO FORMATION:

Model of Faith Development





















IN PAIRS
