Episcopal leaders are amplifying widespread calls for the Trump administration to de-escalate its deployment of federal immigration authorities to American cities. **The U.S. Senate is about to take a vote on a bill giving the Department of Homeland Security billions of dollars in funding that will expand ICE operations.** Contact your senators' offices right now. Call the U.S. Capitol switchboard at **202-224-3121** to be connected to your senators' offices and urge them to refuse to vote for any appropriations bill funding the Department of Homeland Security that fails to rein in ICE.
