Most people don't want to talk about the end of life. But many do want to talk about what matters, what they love, and what they hope will continue. That's where legacy begins.

Seasons of Generosity is a 3-part series beginning in Lent to help churches shift the conversation from discomfort about death to joy in legacy—and from uncertainty to sustainable ministry.

Why This Conversation Matters

Conversations about mortality are often avoided. Conversations about legacy, however, can be life-giving. When churches help people reflect on:

- the ministries that shaped them,
- the values they want to pass on,
- and in the future they hope for their church,

...something changes, and legacy planning becomes:

- an expression of gratitude,
- spiritual practice,
- and a way churches build a faithful pathway toward long-term sustainability.
